

COMPOSITION AND LIGHTING

- Don't put the dog in the middle of the photo — the back of the bench will make your image look unbalanced.
- Leave leading space on the side and where the dog is looking.
- Get down below the dog's level for a more interesting composition.

EDITING

- Cloning Tool: remove dirt from the fur
- Adjustment Brush: make the eyes shine by adding contrast and clarity
- Radial Filter: add a vignette to put the focus on the dog and darken the bench's texture
- Graduated Filter: add light above the dog
- Selective Saturation: make the greens pop

DOG HANDLING

- You need a dog who knows the basic commands lie down and stay.
- Ask the owner to stand a bit further from you and call the dog to catch his attention.
